# Levy failure would cost district \$63.5 million

If the Educational Programs and Operations (EP&O) levy is defeated on February 13, the district will lose \$63.5 million per year starting in September.

To give you a sense of the magnitude of that amount, here are the price tags for just a few of the many items we've negotiated in our contract that are all funded from our local EP&O levy:

Attract and Retain Bonus (\$500-\$9,000 per year)	\$5,325,000

1% Salary Decrease	\$1,125,000
Additional 9% Salary Decrease	\$10,125,000
8 LEAP Days	\$5,000,000

### Don't miss this deduction on your taxes

If you were an eligible educator in 2017, you can deduct up to \$250 of your qualified expenses (this is in addition to your association dues). If you and your spouse are filing jointly and both of you are eligible educators, the maximum deduction is \$500. This deduction is recorded on line 23 of the 1040 form.

An eligible educator is a K-12 teacher, instructor, counselor, principal, or aide who worked in a school for at least 900 hours during a school year.
