10 things to know about the bond and levies

- 1. McCleary only funds what the state defines as "basic education." It does not provide funding for local programs that are not considered basic education.
- 2. There are many programs that people believe are basic education that are not covered by the state's definition. Safety Net, elementary counselors, elementary PE and music teachers, library programs, athletics, activities, nurses, campus security, professional development, and early learning are just a few examples of things that the state does not fund in basic education.
- 3. The Education Programs and Operations (EP&O) Levy provides \$63.5 million each year for programs not funded as basic education.
- 4. Right now, the EP&O levy pays for 36% of special education costs. Even after McCleary is fully implemented, there will still be a gap of 20% between what the state funds and what the district spends. A good portion of this additional cost is attributed to our contract, which provides higher special education staffing levels than what the state funds.
- 5. The state is increasing the state property tax to fund McCleary, but only some of the money collected in Lake Washington will stay here. The rest of it will go to other school districts in the state.
- 6. The state does not fund facility repairs and upkeep. Anytime a school needs new carpeting, painting, HVAC replacement, roof repair/replacement, or increased security, it must be paid for by our local Capital Projects Levy.
- 7. The state does not fund technology. All computers, SmartBoards, peripherals, tech support, data management systems, payroll systems, and networks are paid for by our local Capital Projects Levy.
- School construction and modernization are almost completely funded by local tax dollars through bonds. The state provides very little funding to build schools, and no money to build more classrooms to reduce class sizes.
- Lake Washington is now the 3rd largest school district in the state. We're larger than Tacoma, and growing by an average of 700 students per year. We need to build more schools to accommodate this growth.
- 10. We have 171 portable classrooms in our district---the equivalent of 8 elementary schools. The bond will provide funding to house 2,100 more students.

Deduct your dues

Did you know that you can deduct most of your association dues from your income tax? The dues deduction amount for teachers is as follows:

.76-1.0 FTE	\$1,068.88	Individual
.5175 FTE	\$ 934.60	1040 US
.2650 FTE	\$ 557.88	Name, A NT T
.1025 FTE	\$ 382.76	And SSN CLE

Please remember that your 2017 dues for income tax purposes includes 8 months at the 2016-17 dues rate and 4 months at the 2017-18 dues rate. If you have changed FTE from last year, keep in mind that your dues will be different – you will need assistance in determining the correct dues amount.
