Because the decision on elementary start and end times and the teacher work day won't be decided and announced until March 9, the District and Association have agreed to extend the elementary transfer deadline to March 12. We hope this will help you in making your transfer decision.

If you're considering a transfer, remember that you can always place your name on the list and remove it later if you change your mind. You can also turn down up to two transfer offers and remain where you are. You can't, however, place your name on the transfer list after the March 12 deadline. If you think there could be any reason why you might want a transfer, you may want to put your name on the list just in case.
