## The Legislature is working on the budget now

The legislature is nearing the end of its regular session, scheduled to close on April 23, and the budget talks are underway. Now more than ever, legislators need to hear from you about what you value and the need for the State to live up to its paramount duty to fully fund public schools.

The House budget goes furthest toward fully funding public schools as required by the Supreme Court's McCleary decision. The House education budget makes good progress on the following issues:

- Funds competitive, professional pay and benefits for all educators including future COLAS for K-12 basic education and higher ed
- Funds smaller class sizes beyond K-3 and additional support to meet the social and emotional needs of our students (I-1351)
- Maintains local control and flexibility for districts by protecting local collective bargaining rights and local decision-making, including school levies
- Adds support staff for social and emotional needs of students
- Maintains and supports professional standards regarding certification including the bonus for all National Board Certified Teachers

The Senate budget shows they value limiting taxes more than amply funding schools and maintaining current, vital programs. The Senate doesn't meet the intent of the McCleary case by:

- Eliminating the class size law, essentially eliminating any hope of improving staffing ratios to meet students needs.
- Hurting special education funding
- Restricting pay and/or services to students and reducing local control
- Severely restricting local control over collective bargaining and levies
- Allowing uncertified individuals to teach students with only a background check and high school diploma and no formal education training.
- Cutting state National Board base and challenging schools incentives

# Learn About National Board for Professional Teaching Certification

Have you considered which pathway will work best for you to get your professional certification? Then we invite you to attend one of the information sessions located at the LWSD Resource Center:

- April 20 Sammamish, 4:30-5:30 PM
- May 11 Hughes, 4:30-5:30 PM

National Board Certification is the highest credential in the teaching profession and is a voluntary process established by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS). Certification is achieved through rigorous performance-based assessments that can take 1-5 years to complete. The process measures what accomplished teachers/librarians or school counselors should know and are able to do. In addition, holding a valid NBPTS certificate satisfies the ongoing clock hour requirement for 5 years of a teaching certificate, or the requirements of the Washington State Professional Certificate, whichever is applicable.

#### Master's in teacher leadership at SPU

You are invited to attend an open house to learn more about Seattle Pacific University's (SPU) Master of Education in Teacher Leadership program. This event will take place on May 24, at 4:30 PM in the Morton Johnson room at the Resource Center.

The MEd in Teacher Leadership Program at SPU offers teachers current educational theory, research and professional practices to enhance not only their knowledge and skills as they serve their students, but also provides a foundation of leadership skills to enhance teacher capabilities in a number of school-based roles, from department chair, to instructional coach. The unique aspect of this program is that it is cohort-based, offering a combination of online classes as well as face-to-face courses offered in your own district, with instructors who are both from the university, but also your own district teachers and leaders. The cohort-based program also offers a tuition discount. In addition, you would have the opportunity to use some of the elective credits as ProTeach or National Board credits
