Open enrollment for benefits is now!

The open enrollment period for all benefit plans will be from now to September 29. To make plan changes, you must do so online at this <u>link</u> – open the Documents File. Changes submitted by September 29 will become effective on November 1 and will affect your October 31 paycheck.
