Governor signs McCleary budget for 2018-19

Yesterday, Governor Jay Inslee signed into law <u>Senate Bill 6362</u>, which improves on the McCleary school funding plan the Legislature approved last year---and includes salary increases in the 2018-19 school year.

"With more than a billion dollars in new state funding for K-12 educator salaries, certificated and classified school employees will have a huge opportunity to negotiate significant salary increases this year. Professional, competitive pay is needed to recruit and retain qualified, committed educators for our students," said Kim Mead, WEA President.

In contract negotiations last year, LWEA and the District agreed to a fouryear contract with salary reopeners for the second through fourth years of the contract. The District and Association will begin meeting on April 10 to negotiate salaries for the remaining years of the contract. We hope to have an agreement to bring to you for ratification in early June.

Here are some additional highlights of the bill the Governor signed:

- Modifies statutes to require expedited state salary phase-in to comply with the November 2017 state Supreme Court order. (Fiscal impact: \$1 billion dollars for next school year)
- Delays K-3 class size compliance until 2019-20.
- Increases the special education funding formula.
- Allows early release days in their current form.
- Funds one professional learning day in 2018-19.

Still working on your taxes?

If you're planning to do your taxes this week, don't forget that you can deduct most (but not all) of your association dues from your income tax. The dues deduction amount for teachers is as follows:

.76 - 1.0 FTE	\$1,068.88
.5175 FTE	\$934.60
.2650 FTE	\$557.88
.125 FTE	\$382.76

Please remember that your 2017 dues for income tax purposes includes 8 months at the 2016-17 dues rate and 4 months at the 2017-18 dues rate.

If you changed FTE from last year, keep in mind that your dues amount will be different - you will need assistance in determining the correct dues amount.

Learn About National Board for Professional Teaching Certification

Have you been considering pathways towards professional certification? Then we invite you to attend one of the information sessions located at the LWSD Resource Center:

National Board Certification is the highest credential in the teaching profession and is a voluntary process established by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS). Certification is achieved through rigorous performance-based assessments that can take 1-5 years to complete. In addition, holding a valid NBPTS certificate satisfies the ongoing clock hour requirement for 5 years of a teaching certificate, or the requirements of the Washington State Professional Certificate, whichever is applicable.
